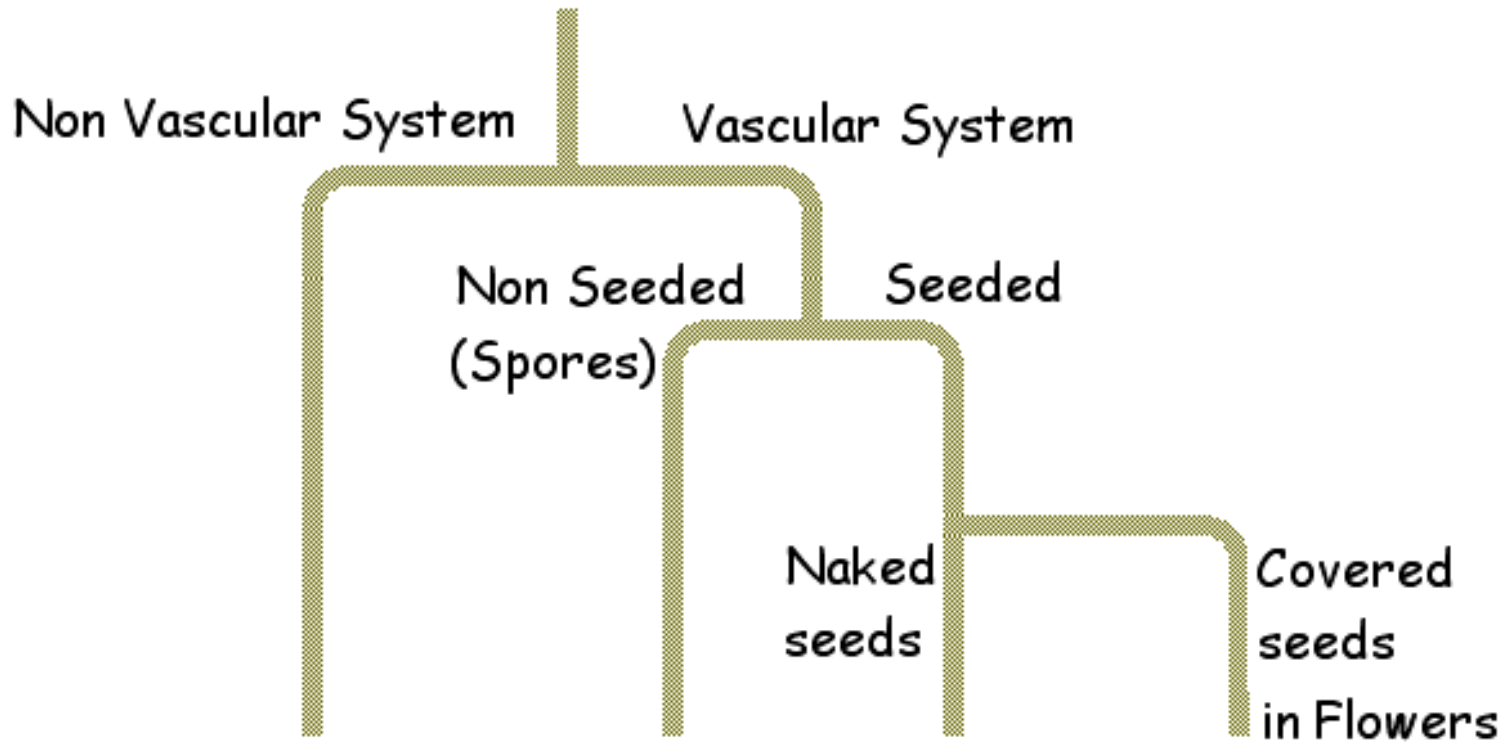

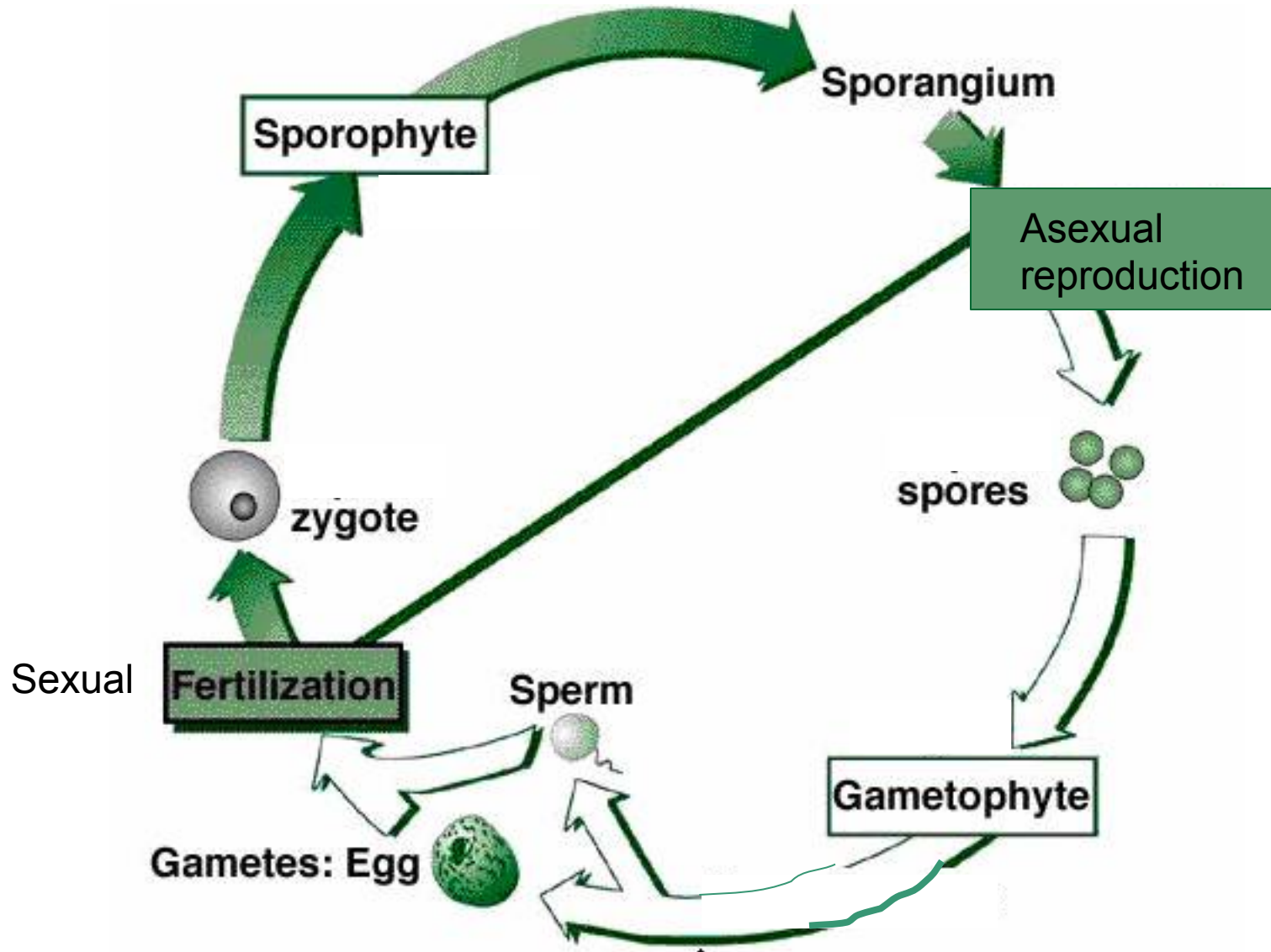

Mosses (Bryophytes)

- Plants that lack a vascular system
- lacks true leaves
- Small hairlike rhizoids instead of roots
- Requires moist environments



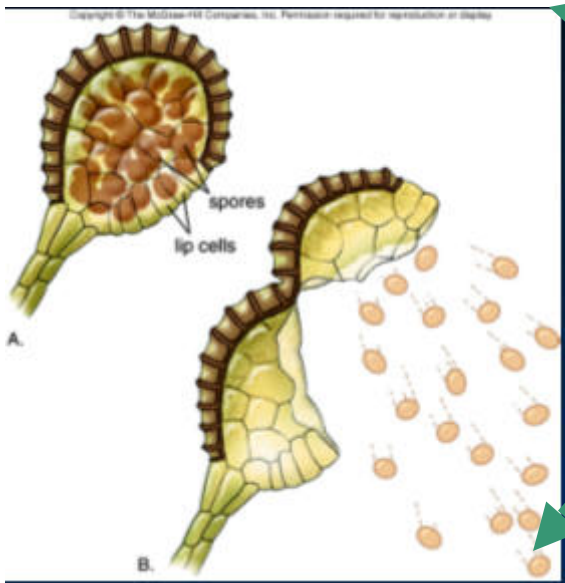
Ferns

- Reproduce asexually by spores



Ferns

- Have a vascular system
- Reproduce asexually by spores
- Large leaves called fronds
- Large underground stems called rhizomes



Gymnosperm

- all are woody trees or shrubs
- they have naked seeds
- most are conifers (cones)
- Needle like leaves

eg. evergreens, cedars,
pine, and fir



Angiosperms

- flowering plants
- Seeds are covered
- contain true leaves
- woody or herbaceous

eg. Tulips, Maple trees, roses
